## Introduction

The higher education institutions are going under immense transformation in terms of evaluation, grading system, implementation of reformed practices like CBCS and utilization of technology in these reforms. This workshop will focus on challenges faced by higher education institutions in terms of examination reforms.

The participants of the Workshop are expected to deliberate upon validity and reliability of existing examination pattern, as well as changes implemented due to introduction of CBCS. The brainstorming sessions in the workshop will be conducted to generate ideas, solutions for providing freedom to teachers and students under CBCS in relation to curricula designing, adoption of teaching methodology and examination methods. These deliberations will help in building a discourse around as to what more can be done to improve the existing examination system. Further this workshop will also include the sessions to discuss uses of technological advancements in examination system including more use of automated examination system like online application, registration, question paper distribution and up gradation of online assessment for students. The discussion will also build a dialogue on CBCS which was intended to provide a system having flexibility and will provide opportunity to students for mobility in pragmatic terms. The workshop will try to find out the answers of practical issues like transfer of students for grades across university in India and different types of course like Discipline centric, Generic and skill development. The

participant will discuss the utility of these courses in practical way.

- Choice Based Evaluation System and Credit Transfers
